This program furthers our goal to support community-based research into solutions to violence and abuse by funding qualifying charitable organizations to do research projects that identify potential strategies, models and methods to ultimately eliminate these issues.

### **Avenue Community Centre for Gender & Sexual Diversity Inc. (Saskatoon, SK)**

#### *Woman to Woman Abuse Project*

The goal of this research is to develop a model of service delivery to individuals experiencing intimate partner violence in same-sex/queer relationships. The objective is to create an appropriate program and pilot it in the fall of 2010.

### **Changing Together– a Centre for Immigrant Women (Edmonton, AB)**

#### *Baseline Study of Human Trafficking in Alberta*

The research project will provide a baseline study on human trafficking in the province of Alberta. Using ACT's extensive network of province-wide chapters, information will be gathered among agencies and individuals to identify trends and patterns in human trafficking within the province.

### **Family Service Saskatoon (Saskatoon, SK)**

#### *Saskatoon Community Partners for Violence Free Families – Whole Family Programming Project*

This research will explore what, if any, whole family programming is currently offered in North America to individuals affected by intimate partner violence. This information will be used to determine which programs are most appropriate as well as what evaluation tools can be used to move to implement programming in Saskatchewan.

### **Ikwe-Widdjiitiwin (Winnipeg, MB)**

#### *Women Helping One Another: Evaluation of Ikwe-Widdjiitiwin Inc*

The goal of this project is to evaluate the services of Ikwe-Widdjiitiwin currently being provided to women and their children and how these programs can be developed or improved.

### **Nova House (Selkirk, MB)**

#### *Data Management and Analysis for the Healing Journey*

This grant will allow for the third wave of data analysis to take place with the extensive research gathered through The Healing Journey Longitudinal Study in Manitoba.

### **Peace River Regional Women's Shelter Society**

#### *Data Management and Analysis for the Healing Journey Project in Alberta*
